Our show is set in 2008, a time where not only I was in high school like our characters, but also personally surrounded by punk music (both brothers of mine were in Punk Bands in Regional NSW). I too felt first hand, like that of the characters, that it's hard not to be mad, when the only other emotion we attempt. had was boredom. Something I still see a lot of in the schoolyard today.

Simon Stephen's writing allows us to transform stock standard high school tropes, into fully fledged characters. We as a team worked incredibly hard to find the balance between the anger and boredom of our characters to give something that feels performative but also familiar. When the teachers weren't around, we had to make our time up with the 'friends' we had to see 5 times a day every week. Think the Breakfast Club without a filter.

I'll finish by saying no show exists without the entire team committed to putting it up on its feet. Thanks to those in the cast who prepared for this intense show two times a week, my crew for always being ready to take a question (even those who came last minute), and my AD Dani who brought

the most essential thing, joy, to every rehearsal.

But the biggest thanks goes to Maddie Richards, Producer, Actor, Director- and whatever hat she needs-, for being the beating heart and brains of Lunatix. It's incredible to work with a brand new company, one that prides itself as feeling incredibly confident, unflinching and eager to go further with



Grace McLaughlin


She/Her
